**Elementary, Junior High:** Based on a 325 minutes instructional day X 178 days = 964 hours; subtracting 9 hours for early dismissals = **955** hours. The minimum instructional hours required is 950/year.

**Semestered High School:** 1st Semester based on 340 minutes instructional day X 92 days = 521 hours; subtracting 4.5 hours for early dismissals = **516.5** hours. 2nd Semester based on 340 minutes instructional day X 90 days = 510 hours; subtracting 4.5 hours for early dismissals = **505.5** hours. The minimum instructional hours required is 500 per semester.
